

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello Spring! I felt so happy walking in the sun the other day. Sun after rain will do that to you. Spring is also the time for creatives to reenergize. So I picked out some key focus points for myself this Spring and thought I'd share them.

Attentiveness. Where is my focus? Remind myself to keep centering in on my goal. Notice the singular "goal". Too many goals at once diffuse my focus, which I'm quite guilty of. "Work on one idea at a time. When artists are flooded with ideas it becomes difficult to focus and complete a project. As an artist you have lots of ideas and visuals floating around in your imagination. Write them all down... and then commit to ONE. Start it and see it through" (source).

Practice keeps me in shape. Keep doing it. It doesn't stop. As my father repeatedly reminded me, "To do it is not to learn it, to do it again and again is the learning process."

Destruction and rebirth. There is a quote that has been tossed around the creative writing circles for a long time, "...kill your baby." I don't remember the whole quote, but I don't need to. I understand what it means. Time and again I've gotten hung up on a collage because I loved one part of it. I did not want to let go of that one part that I loved. Yet the 'whole' did not work. So, toss that really cool image aside and use it elsewhere. Even be brave enough to tear it in half!?

Finish and move on to the next piece. Don't hold your art as sacred, keep moving, keep developing. There is more in there/out there, that won't be found if you are stuck on a "masterpiece."

Finally, I'll try and keep in mind, 'We are not trying to find perfection in art, we are trying to find our best voice.'

April 15, 2023

<u>Sherry Ying Ruden</u> will join NWCS members at the Shoreline Masonic Center on April 15th 2023 to discuss her innovative use of traditional materials, namely Chinese rice paper, paint, ink, and cold wax. Sherry is an award-winning artist based in Seattle whose paintings have been widely exhibited nationally. Inspired by her life in the East and West, Sherry uses Chinese Xuan (rice) paper, which, though fragile, is surprisingly versatile. She continuously experiments with different methods, resulting in striking but subtle and luminescent outcomes. In contrast to Chinese paintings created with brush and ink, where the artwork is mounted afterwards, Sherry reverses the process, manipulating the material and creating shapes and colors based on the paper's natural grain and texture. She



Nature, or the interconnectedness of all things. Sherry's artistic process is specific yet spontaneous,



allowing the imagery to evolve organically. Sherry's work nods to traditional Chinese brush painting but goes well beyond the expected, connecting her surfaces to our contemporary world.

June 20, 2023




The fifth annual World Collage Day will be celebrated on May 13, 2023. Again this year, NW Collage Society members will have the opportunity to exchange postcards.

All you need to do is create a collage of your choice on a 4 x 6 substantial substrate.


John will email you the address of your recipient and directions on May 1st. Stamp it and mail it after May 1st but before May 13th.

TIPS AND TAKEAWAYS

HEIC vs JPG

HEIC is the file format name Apple has chosen for the new HEIF (High Efficiency Image Format) Standard. Using advanced and modern compression methods, it allows photos to be created in smaller file sizes while retaining a higher image quality compared to JPEG/JPG. Most browsers still do not support this file format, so it is necessary to convert your HEIC files to JPG prior to submitting them for shows.

Convert on phone: To convert HEIC files to JPG on your **iPhone**, change their format to "Most Compatible" in *Settings*. You can convert HEIC photos to JPG on **Mac** while in Preview. **On Windows**, you can convert HEIC images to JPG using the Photos app.

NAMING YOUR IMAGE FOR SHOWS

All images that are entered for shows should have proper naming.. This is really important for those managing the website. It saves us a lot of time if you name your images. Please use this format: LastName_FirstName_Title_Size.jpg (Example: Doe_Jane_wheres_the_sunshine_12wx18h.jpg)

How do you name the image if you are only using your phone?

Android:

There are a few ways to name a photo in your gallery. One way is to open the photo in your gallery, select the ... for more and select the "Rename" option. Another way is to open the photo in your gallery and select the "Edit" option. Once you are in the editing menu, select the "Rename" option. From How To Rename Photos On Android Phone

iPhone:

- 1. Open the **Photos** app on your iPhone.
- 2. Locate the image that you want to rename.
- 3. Select the image.
- 4. In the bottom left corner, tap the **Share Sheet** icon.
- 5. Scroll down and tap Save to Files.
- 6. Navigate to the location where you wish to save the photo.
- 7. At the bottom of the page, tap the **image title**.
- 8. Enter a new name for the photo.
- 9. Tap the **Done** button on your virtual keyboard.




Any theme is acceptable. No racist, pornographic, or sexist works will be displayed. The call is open to people from all over the world.

Their second deck of collage art playing cards will be based on a juried selection of artworks featured in the *New Dimensions show.*






