I think that seeing faces in nature is quite common, probably because as humans, we naturally gravitate toward the human face. You can see what appears to be faces on everything from moth wings to tree trunks. There is a chapter in the book that relates how artists from the earliest times were "inspired to set free the figures they saw within a piece of stone or timber." "Michelangelo spoke of liberating the figures hidden or imprisoned in a block of marble." I think this is an artist's approach. Mulling and envisioning until something appears.

An artist friend of mine told me that she was inspired by an afternoon shadow on her blank canvas. The composition appeared in light and dark shadow, which she followed up on. "You'd be surprised how many compositions I have begun this way," she said. "I just let light play on a surface and see a scene."

Likewise, I recall a painting of a squirrel that my Dad did. Apparently it started out as something else entirely - but the piece just wouldn't materialize, so he crumpled up the heavy watercolor paper and when he opened it up again, the dappled shadows of the outdoor light played on his paper and he saw a squirrel and proceeded to bring ("paint") it to life.

I'm sure we all have these stories of the unexpected coming to life as we collage, paint, draw. It is the serendipity of art that releases its true spirit.

## **NWCS SUMMER ACTIVITY**



Our summer 2022 activity will be tiny collages. That is correct, small collages are in your future should you sign up for this activity. Have you ever made ATCs (artist trading cards) or APCs (artist playing cards)? They are lots of fun and perhaps a challenge since ATCs and APCs are only 3.5 x 2.5 inches. That is the size of a baseball trading card or playing cards.

John Arbuckle will facilitate this summer ATC or APC project. It will be run similarly to the postcard project for World Collage Day. All you have to do is let him know you wish to participate by June 15th. He will compile a list of participants and send out the directions along with the participant list near the end of June. Your responsibility will be to send out one ATC or APC to someone on the list monthly....one ATC for July, one for August, and one for September. Easy peasy! It really is like a tiny postcard or a mini collage.

Here is what you should do...

1. Email John at **johnner55@yahoo.com** if you wish to participate by June 15, 2022.

2. Please **include your snail mail address** so he doesn't have to look them up.

3. Wait until the end of June when the list comes out with the directions for the exchange.

4. While you are waiting gather some ideas for your ATC. Pinterest is a great place to do a search. There are books on making ATCs and maybe your library has one of them. If you like, you can even start making them now. Use a heavier watercolor paper or the like so they are sturdy. Remember the dimensions.

That is it. Email questions if you have them and he will address them all.



## **CALL FOR ART**



Local teaching artist Maja Sereda is partnering with NWCS members **Cheryl Chudyk** and **Suzanne Winkel** to create a call for collages to be curated into a printed publication to support her <u>Guardians of the Jungle project</u>.

**Create a collage** to raise awareness of her cause, exploring the **sense of interconnectedness** within the jungle and how it extends beyond its borders. Maja's project focuses on the threatened habitat in the vitally important Madre de Dios region of the Peruvian Amazon. It is a complex ecosystem, home to indigenous tribes, with the highest biodiversity per capita in the world, but it remains largely unresearched and is not nationally protected. Loggers, poachers, and goldminers who use mercury are a threat to this home of countless heartbeats, but like the animals, they too are looking for ways to survive.

Submissions must be TIFF format, 7"w x10.5"h and 300dpi. Click <u>here</u> for more information on how to submit. Selected artists will receive a complimentary copy but will need to pay shipping. Deadline: **June 26th, 2022**
