As our fall show deadline draws near I spent some time thinking about what inspires me about collage. There are many aspects, but here are a couple:

I think what most inspires me about a collage is when I see an artist's use of one thing for another. For instance, the use of seaweed for a tree, a piece of bark that becomes a beetle, a shell becomes a hat. The unexpected makes me take a second look. In my mind, using papers is much like using paint, but using ephemera and other materials takes the piece a step further. It brings intrigue. An ahha to the viewer.

"The waste of the world becomes my art," a quotation attributed to Kurt Schwitters in the 1930s, expresses a lot of collage artists inspiration. How can we reuse this? I love the concept of repurposing. And try to incorporate that into some of my collages.

Another thing that draws me into a piece is - what is left out. "The secret of being a bore is to tell everything," said <u>Voltaire</u> "... art very often needs lines that disappear, it needs subjects that are suggested rather than told, it needs incomplete areas so viewers can complete for themselves," <u>Robert Genn</u>. This way the viewer becomes engaged, and it stretches the artist to think beyond the literal. Leaving it out is often a more challenging part of building a composition, but I love it when I can get this important aspect of the design to work.

### **NWCS SEPTEMBER PROGRAM**

### <u>September 20, 2022</u>

Kamela Daniels will kick off the NWCS's 2022–23 season by sharing her path to establishing Catalyst Fine Art, which operates a gallery located in The Lodge at St. Edward Park. Kamela grew up in the Seattle area, where her father, David Daniels, was an artist and educator. After her father died, Kamela stepped away from the formal arts community, but continued to find new artistic outlets (including learning to weld) and to create works for her home and friends, while raising her family. In 2012, Kamela found her way back to a career in fine arts, working as the Studio Manager for Julie Speidel until she retired from sculpting. Catalyst Fine Art was established in 2018 and began by creating temporary exhibitions and advising and collaborating with local artists. The gallery at The Lodge opened in 2021, and Catalyst Fine Art now offers rotating and permanent exhibitions of works by emerging and established international and local artists, and collaborates with The Lodge to host workshops, live-music events, and an artist-in-residence program. Catalyst also partners with local galleries and art organizations to increase the visibility of Pacific Northwest artists. In addition to sharing the details of her journey with us, Kamela will describe an upcoming opportunity for NWCS members to create holiday ornaments, which will decorate various trees located at The Lodge and be offered for sale. 

# **TIPS AND TECHNIQUES**

### **COLLAGE JOURNALS**

It's a simple idea, but they can be a good creative break from larger projects, or an effective warm-up too. Use your scraps and imagination to create quick collages that are purely for YOU. Then easily set aside until you're ready to add more! They are a great project for both beginner and advanced collage artists. I find them enjoyably addictive!

Make your pages mixed and all askew, or clean and lined up perfectly, large or small – it's all to your taste only. The journal can have a chosen theme or color scheme (I made a rhyme...) You know those precious little pieces you want to save for yourself – this is a perfect way to preserve them too.


There's something about the feel of the pages, the different textures and sounds the paper makes that I find irresistible when looking through these journals. Go further with creative pockets, fabric, ribbon or a clever closure for the book. I hope you try one and have a lot of fun with these too.

- \*Use thick cord, not regular thread. There is binding cord available at craft stores.
- \*Look up all the different binding methods you can use some are quite decorative.
- \*Large needles can be found at the craft stores or online.
- \*Use large binder clips to hold your journal while poking the holes and binding.
